New Year's Eve and Day: There will be a Holy Hour on New Year's Eve from 11pm-11:50pm followed by Low Mass at midnight. On New Year's Day there will be a 9am Low Mass and 11:30am High Mass. January 1st is a Holy Day of Obligation in the US. All Catholics are bound under pain of mortal sin to attend Mass, even if they are unable to get to their own parish.

A plenary indulgence may be gained by publicly saying or singing the Te Deum in thanksgiving on the last day of the year (Dec 31st). A plenary indulgence may also be gained by publicly saying or singing the Veni Creator Spiritus on the first day of the year, Jan 1st. (Handbook of Indulgences, Norms 19 & 20).
