## The Creed

### 11. Creation and Rural Life (cont'd)

7. Rural life develops a man's dignity and personality: First of all, farm life supplies an environment in which the sacramental graces of matrimony can take fruitful effect. The purpose of matrimony is not only the procreation but also the rearing and education of children. The farm provides an ideal setting for the development of the family. Unlike in the large cities, where parents are often away from home at work, here the whole family works as a unit. Here the children grow up under constant parental guidance, direction and training. In fact, the farm might be called the only and last stronghold of the family - and of religion.

Secondly, the farmer enjoys independence, freedom and self-respect - attributes which are of the very essence of human personality. He is not an insignificant unit in an army of propertyless city workers, but looks with pride and satisfaction on the fruitful soil which he cultivates and which is his own. When hard times come, and dejected city dwellers begin to take their place in the bread lines, he can go to his larder for the good things which he has providentially stored away.

Finally, the development of all one's faculties, which contributes so powerfully to the dignity of the human person, is especially facilitated by farm life. Few vocations demand so much knowledge, skill and experience as farming does. A farmer must know his seeds and soils, his poultry and his cattle, his tools and his machinery, his markets and his investments. A farmer must be, as some one has so well said, "not merely a man of brawn but also a man of brains."

### 12. Science and Faith

In his readings, the student occasionally comes across what are called "scientific" objections to faith. Science (biology, geology, paleontology, etc.) is said to contradict revelation (Scripture, tradition).

In order to have a genuine conflict between faith and science, the revealed truth must be infallibly defined and the scientific truth established beyond a shadow of a doubt. There are no cases on record where these two conditions are verified in a so-called conflict of faith and science. What is sometimes considered as an infallibly defined truth is in reality a matter of free discussion among scripturists and the theologians; what is regarded as a scientific truth is in fact only a hypothesis and theory.
