The Creed

13. The Elevation of Man

How marvelous are the gifts which God bestowed upon man in the natural order, gifts which constitute him a human being! How each one of them mirrors forth the wisdom, goodness and love of Him in whose image man was made! By his soul - which separates him and sharply distinguishes him from the animal kingdom - man thinks and loves, transfers himself with the rapidity of lightning to the throne of God or to the bosom of the earth. His mind, aided by the unfailing concurrent causation of God, penetrates the secrets of nature, conquers distance, time and space, and subjugates for the good of man vast and hitherto undreamed-of forces and treasures. His will undertakes deeds of daring, of sacrifice, of virtue which can merit for his soul a high degree of natural happiness in the next world. Truly did the Psalmist exclaim, "Thou has made him a little less than the angels; thou has crowned him with glory and honor" (8:6).

Extraordinary or Preternatural Gifts

If the natural endowments of Adam and Eve proclaimed the wisdom of the Creator, how much more did the preternatural or extraordinary gifts of our first parents declare the goodness of God. The latter gifts are so called because they are "above" or "outside" of what is required for the perfection of human nature as such. They are perfections not due to man, they are gratuitous gifts. Let us explain each one briefly:

(a) Freedom from concupiscence: Concupiscence flows naturally from man's constitution. His senses and fleshly impulses are often immoderately attracted by the object of their desires. They strive after their perfection in a manner opposed to right reason. In all such cases there arises a struggle between the flesh and the mind, between matter and spirit. In our first parents before the Fall, the senses and imagination were perfectly subject to reason. They did not precede nor resist man's will. The lower faculties were perfectly subordinated to the higher, which in turn were wholly subject to God. This absence of all inordinate tendencies in human nature, this subordination and co-ordination of man's faculties, this complete harmony in man's being constituted the gift of freedom from concupiscence. The external peace in the Garden of Eden was a reflection of the peace in man's mind and heart. The loss of this gift is described in Genesis 3:6-11.
