Divine Mercy Indulgence

Usual Conditions for every Plenary Indulgence

- Sacramental confession [according to previously issued norms, within about 20 days before or after]
- Eucharistic communion [according to previously issued norms, preferably on the day, or the days before or after]
- Prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff [certain prayers are not Specified]

Specific Conditions for this Indulgence

On Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy or in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus, e.g., "Merciful Jesus, I trust in you!"

A partial indulgence is granted to the faithful who, at least with a contrite heart, pray to the merciful Lord Jesus a legitimately approved invocation, e.g., "Jesus I trust in You", "My Jesus, mercy" or any other approved invocation.

Duty of Priests

- Priests who exercise pastoral ministry, especially parish priests, should inform the faithful in the most suitable way of the Church's salutary provision of a plenary indulgence.
- Promptly and generously be willing to hear their confessions: this does not necessarily have to be on Divine Mercy Sunday itself since that is not a condition for the indulgence.
- The confession requirement does not have to be met on the feast itself. That would be an impossible burden for the clergy if it did. The Communion requirement is easily met, since Sunday is a day of obligation. The norm of 20 days before or after the indulgenced work suffices.

We are caught up on Mass Requests: Please submit your Mass requests (only 3 requests in the queue at a time please). Forms are available on our website and in the parish office.

Altar Boy Society: Guild of St. Stephen-Saturday, May 4th is the next meeting for our altar boy society. The guild continues to grow with 17 members currently. Boys age 12 or under who have received First Communion are invited to join. The boys have been meeting with the priests monthly on 1st Saturdays after the 9am Mass for a spiritual talk, extensive practice serving at Mass, recreation, and pizza for lunch. Serving at the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass: We currently have 74 weekday low Masses scheduled from May 1st to July 2nd. The good news is that we have received enough volunteer men and boys to provide servers for 46 of those 74 Masses. We are very grateful for the families who have made it a priority to come to Mass during the week and who have offered their boys as servers for the Mass. The bad news is that we have no altar boys scheduled for the 28 weekday Masses over the next 2 months. The work of a parish is a collaboration between the priests and the Faithful. Many people have made sacrifices for the parish over the years, but we are currently lacking altar boys for serving during the week. We have published a list of these days below so that if one of your boys knows how to serve, perhaps you would consider volunteering for one or more of those days. Please do not forget that **next Saturday** is the next Guild of St. Stephen, our society for altar boys. If your boy has not yet joined, but he is interested in joining, he is most welcome. We had 12 boys join the guild at our first meeting in March, and then we had 17 at our April meeting. I hope the guild continues to grow so that we can eventually have boys who know how to serve the Mass and are willing to do so.
