“If you want to be close to Christ, I repeat to you ‘Ite ad Ioseph’: Go to Joseph!” said Ven. Pius XII in 1955 as he instituted the feast of St. Joseph the Worker, to be celebrated on May 1.

“Each of us can discover in Joseph -- the man who goes unnoticed, a daily, discreet and hidden presence -- an intercessor, a support and a guide in times of trouble,” he wrote. “St. Joseph reminds us that those who appear hidden or in the shadows can play an incomparable role in the history of salvation.”--Pope Francis

The Year of St. Joseph provides the opportunity for Catholics to receive a plenary indulgence by reciting any approved prayer or act of piety in honor of St. Joseph on May 1, the Feast of St. Joseph the Worker.

The *Regina Caeli* is the Marian antiphon used during Eastertide, from Easter Day through Pentecost. Traditionally it is said or sung after night prayer, immediately before going to sleep. It also replaces the *Angelus* during Eastertide.
