

THE CHURCH UNITY OCTAVE, January 18-25, is traditionally offered for the unity of the entire Catholic Church. If you would like to participate, please feel free to take a copy of the prayers in the vestibule.

CANDLES FOR CANDLEMAS: This year in preparation for the traditional blessing of candles on February 2, the Feast of the Purification, we are offering for sale a set of candles specifically made for Candlemas. The set consists of two, high-quality church candles, of 51% beeswax, and may be had for \$7 a set. They must be purchased *before* the blessing at Candlemas and may be collected afterwards. Orders may be placed in the bookstore on Sundays, or, with exact change, in the church office during the week.

ASH WEDNESDAY is just over a month away. If you have any palms fronds from last year, you may bring them to the office so that we may burn them to make the ashes for Ash Wednesday.

ST. FRANCIS DE SALES was born of devout and noble parents in the town of Sales, from which his family took its name. He was given a liberal education, devoted himself to the study of philosophy and theology at Paris and gained the degree of Doctor in civil and canon law at Padua. When he had been ordained priest and made provost of the church of Geneva, he carried out the duties of his office so well that Bishop de Granier sent him to preach the word of God in Chablais in order to win the inhabitants away from the heresy of Calvin. He undertook this mission with such great zeal and overcame so many dangers with the help of God that he is said to have brought back to the Catholic faith some seventy-two thousand heretics. When de Granier died, Francis was consecrated bishop. He founded a new order of nuns, named for the Visitation of the Blessed Virgin, and enlightened the Church with writings filled with heavenly teaching. At Lyon, he was seized by a grave illness and departed to heaven in the year 1622. He was declared a Doctor of the Universal Church by Pope Pius IX.
