Epiphany Water: The solemn blessing of the Epiphany water will take place on Wednesday at 3:00 p.m. This elaborate blessing originates from the Eastern Church and takes about 45 minutes. If you would like to bring your own water to be blessed, please respect the following:

1. Only one-gallon bottles of water with a screw cap on top are permitted as the priest must open and close each one.
2. We will bless only one such bottle per household. Please ensure your name is clearly marked on the bottle.
3. Please do not bring anything else to be blessed, as this ceremony is only for the Epiphany water.

Note: Holy Water, Epiphany or otherwise, is not to be drunk or consumed. It is intended to be either sprinkled or kept in its container.

Epiphany Chalk: Please help yourselves to a piece of blessed Epiphany chalk which will be found in a basket in the vestibule of the church. This chalk is used to make the traditional inscription on the

lintel above the main door to your dwelling, on the outside. The inscription for this year should read: 20 + C + M + B + 22. Anyone can make the inscription as the chalk will have already been blessed by a priest.

Epiphany Blessings: Since we now have well over four hundred families in our parish, thanks be to God, it has become quite impossible for us to travel around to do the Epiphany house blessings in the week following Epiphany. In order not to favor any particular families, we have decided not to make any exceptions this year. We would be more than happy to bless the houses of the faithful with the usual blessing at any other time during the year.

Living Rosary: All are invited to join the living rosary for the FSSP and the traditional Mass, which may be found at www.fssp.de/rosarium. Even if all the spots are filled, you may of course still offer your rosary or other prayers and sacrifices for the same intention.
